## COSA Leads offers new degree designed for district leaders and current or aspiring superintendents

SALEM – COSA Leads and its educational partner, Concordia University of Chicago, have expanded their licensure and degree offerings with a new specialist degree for Oregon educators interested in serving as district leaders or superintendents. The Ed.S. (Education Specialist) program is intended for candidates who already have a master's degree in Education and are seeking to advance their school and district leadership career.

The COSA-CUC Ed.S. degree helps qualify individuals for superintendent and central office administrator positions. Some states and districts require these candidates to have an Ed.S., and it is commonly regarded as a competitive advantage.

The program consists of 30 credit hours, including eight classes and two internship terms. The degree does *not* require a dissertation. Completion of the course work also qualifies the candidate for Oregon Professional Administrator Licensure (ProAL). The Ed.S. program would fulfill the first 30 hours of an Ed.D. (61 hours) or a Ph.D. (67 hours) program, both of which are offered through the COSA Leads licensure and degree program.

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## COSA/CUC Ed.S. Degree Program

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### **Q: What is the Ed.S?**

A: An **Education Specialist Degree (Ed.S.)** is a post-master's degree program that is common in the education field. This program allows candidates to earn an Ed.S. degree at the same time as they complete the requirements for Oregon's Professional Administrator License(ProAL).

### **Q: Why would I want an Ed.S.?**

Individuals seeking district coordinator and director jobs, as well as superintendent positions, obtain an Ed.S. degree to be competitive in the candidate selection process.

### **Q: Can I get financial aid? Can I transfer classes?**

A: Yes, the Ed.S. is a degree program that qualifies for financial aid. Candidates can transfer in up to five courses with approval; transfer courses must have been graded to qualify.

### **Q: How do I take classes?**

A: The program is largely online. The first class in Summer 2019 is taught face-to-face during a one-week academy, and the two internships are undertaken at the candidate's district.

### **Q: What courses do I need for the Ed.S. degree and Oregon's ProAL license?**

A: You will need these 10 courses (30 semester hours). Asterisks identify classes required for Oregon's ProAL licensure.

### **Q: What else do I need to know?**

A: This is an advanced degree – beyond a master's degree – but it does not require a dissertation. And students must already have a master's degree in Education or a related field.

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
