Though some of the reaction may dissipate, there are undercurrents that will continue based on the long history of similar events. Attendees will learn about Oregon's vision for Career Connected Learning, Work-Based Learning, the connection to Perkins V, and collaboration efforts in building a WBL infrastructure in Oregon.
