What is ESSA?

- Main goal is to advance education equity
- Provides a well-rounded and supportive education for all students
- Provides flexibility in 4 key areas:
 - Assessment
 - Accountability
 - School Improvement
 - Educator Effectiveness
- Retains safeguards to ensure appropriate accountability
- States must submit a State Plan



- Integrated accountability system to include English language proficiency and academic achievement.






Accountability & reporting

A Continued Commitment to Supporting ELs in Oregon

EL Strategic Plan Update

- Group of EL practitioners and experts met over the past six months
- Revised the goals and activities of the 2013-2016 EL Strategic Plan
- EL Strategic Plan aligns to the Oregon Department of Education goals



EL Strategic Plan Update



Designed around State Supports for:

- Recruitment and retention of EL professionals
- Social/emotional support for EL students
- Professional development: Sheltered Instruction, growth mindset, culturally responsive practice, trauma-informed care
- Translation services
- Parent/Community Engagement



Transformation and Target EL Districts

- HB 3499 Advisory Group
- Composed of ELD teachers, district administrators, parents, community based organizations, university researchers, legislative representation, and ODE staff
- Provided guidance to identify the Transformation and Target districts based on high or low needs and outcomes for EL students
- Helped design what technical assistance would look like for identified districts
