Under normal practices the college class can result in a college grade different from that of the high school class grade. In the best interest of students we are still encouraging that students are awarded a letter grade for their college coursework.

While on the surface the idea of a Pass / No Pass grade on a college transcript may sound preferable, there are potentially very serious negative impacts of Pass / No Pass grades on the transferability of a college course, and on the course's ability to meet a students college degree requirements.

For those students wishing to change their college grade to Pass / No Pass, despite it not being advised, please contact your dual credit coordinator for guidance to facilitate that process
