

There are 4 main components: Improvement Aim, Primary Drivers, Secondary Drivers, & Change Ideas.	
Step 1: State Your Aim	
Step 2: Identify Your Primary Drivers (i.e. overview of the landscape of change)	
Step 3: Identify Your Secondary Drivers (i.e. key levers for productive change)	
Step 4: Identify Change Ideas (i.e. new programs, existing processes that may be changed, new tools, or new norms).
