



OASP/COSA Aspiring Superintendents Leadership Opportunity

Q: Is this opportunity the same as the Oregon Administrator Scholars Program?

A: No. The OASP award is for Principal or Professional Administrator licensure candidates. The Aspiring Superintendents award is for candidates seeking their Ed.S. degree, which includes ProAL licensure.

Q: Can I still apply if I have already received an Oregon Administrator Scholars Program award?

A: Yes, but your total scholarship award cannot exceed \$20,000. If you have received a \$10,000 OASP award previously, for example, you are still eligible for a \$10,000 scholarship from this program.

Q: What else is included besides the scholarship award?

A: Lots! Your COSA support team is ready to provide 24/7 mentoring, and successful applicants are guaranteed space in the Aspiring Superintendent Seminar series and New Superintendent Academy, and complimentary registration for COSA's Equity Academy I or II.

Q: The application says applicants must be diverse or linguistically diverse. What does linguistically diverse mean?

A: It means fluent in a first language that is not English. For a full explanation of all terms, refer to the application.

Q: What if I am not enrolled in the COSA-CUC ProAL program?

A: Candidates will complete an application that includes consideration for the scholarship opportunity as well as admittance to COSA's university partner, Concordia Chicago. The university application fee will be deferred.

Q: What if I'm already in the COSA-CUC ProAL program?

A: You are still eligible for the award.

Q: What is the deadline and how do I apply?
