2020 Legislative Session

Key Dates and Deadlines

- Organizational Days: **January 13-16**
- Pre-Session Bill Filing Deadline: **January 17**
- Bills Posted Online: **January 27**
- First Day of Session: **February 3**
- First Chamber Deadlines: **Feb. 7 and 14**
- Second Chamber Deadlines: **Feb. 20 and 27**
- Constitutional Sine Die: **March 8**



2020 Legislative Session

COSA Policy Priorities

- Funding for District/ESD “Grow Your Own” Programs
- Dual Credit/Transferability of Credit
- Small High School Grants/Dorms - remove July 1, 2020 Sunset
- Oppose efforts to change or alter Student Success Act or Revenue Package



2020 Legislative Session

Emerging Issues and Likely Bills

- Class Size as a Mandatory Subject
- Climate Change/Carbon Pricing
- Brain Injury “Return to Learn” Legislation
- Computer Science Plan
- Authority to Decide Diploma Requirements
- Bills available for review approx. January 27th
- Limited number of bills - Roughly 250 bills



Funding Review and Update

School funding in the 2019-21 Biennium

K-12 Funding for the 2019-21 Biennium

Key Investments from the 2019 Session

- House Bill 5016 - \$9.0 Billion State School Fund
- Measure 98 Full Funding - \$303 million
 - Funding Tied to Student Success Act (\$133 million)
- Student Success Act (House Bill 3427) - \$472 million Student Investment Account in 20-21
 - **\$664 per ADMw for the 2020-21 school year**
- K-12 Facilities Bonding (House Bill 5005)
 - \$125 million for OSCIM bond matching grants
 - \$100 million for Seismic Rehabilitation Grants

Election Preview

On the 2020 Ballot

- 1 U.S. Senator and 5 Congressional seats
- Secretary of State, Treasurer, Attorney General
- All 60 State House seats and 15/30 State Senate seats
- Two Legislative Referrals:
 - Campaign Finance Limits
 - Tobacco Tax
- Dozens of potential other measures
 - PERS, tolls, gun safety, taxes, drugs, pesticides, redistricting, and more...

Oregon Legislature will have at least 16 open seats in 2020
