








White Supremacy



White supremacy as a system. When we talk about white supremacy, we mean:

- A system of oppression based on privileging whiteness
- Operates at both an individual and a structural level
- Racial animus or hatred is not a necessary factor in perpetuating this system



White Nationalism

White nationalism is a movement. Initially a euphemism for white supremacy, now its own distinct ideology

- Built on an anti-Semitic conspiracy theory
- Seeks to build political power
- Trades in misogyny, homophobia, and transphobia in communications and as a recruitment pipeline
- Has anti-immigrant, anti-Black, and anti-Muslim policy goals

Red-Pilling: Offering the truth to awaken action


Revolutionary Terms and Images: Deep patriotism to play to Trump supporters

Great Replacement: Immigration and government policies leading to white genocide

Accelerationism: The government is too pluralistic and liberal. Violent action now can cause the Boogaloo and begin the RAHOWA

ZOG: Zionist Occupied Governemnt manipulating our politicans with globalist money

Voting will not remove them & There Is No Political Solution (TINPS): The fraudulent and stolen election proves that violence is necessary



The Oregon Donation Land Act (9/27/1850)

Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, ...granted to every white settler or occupant of the public lands, American half-breed Indians included, above the age of eighteen years, ... the quantity of one half section, or three hundred and twenty acres of land, if a single man, and if a married man, ... the quantity of one section, or six hundred and forty acres, one half to himself and the other half to his wife...

Oregon Constitution

Article II

Section 6. No Negro, Chinaman, or Mulatto shall have the right of suffrage.

Article XIII

Section 2. ... Do you vote for slavery in Oregon? Yes or No. And also this question. Do you vote for the free Negroes in Oregon? Yes or No. "Free Negroes, yes." "Free Negroes, no." "Slavery, yes." "Slavery, no."

Section 4. No free Negro, or Mulatto, not residing in this state at the time of the adoption of this constitution, shall come, reside, or be within this state, or hold any real estate, or make any contracts, or maintain any suit therein; an the Legislative Assembly shall provide by penal laws, for the removal, by public officers, of all such Negroes, and Mulattos, and for their effectual exclusion from the state, and for the punishment of persons who shall bring them into the state, or employ, or harbor them."-

Article XV


Section 8. No Chinaman, not a resident of the state at the adoption of this constitution, shall ever hold any real estate, or mining claim, or work any mining claim therein.



Ideology: Primarily alt lite: Misogynistic, Islamophobic, transphobic and anti-immigration. Western Chauvanists. Some members espouse white supremacist and anti-Semitic ideologies and/or engage with white supremacist groups.

Boogaloo

"Boogalooers" hold the anti-government and anti-law enforcement attitudes common in the early years of the militia movement. The term "boogaloo" is a slang reference to a future civil war.

The ideology of the Boogaloo movement is still developing but is primarily anti-government, anti-authority and anti-police in nature.



III or Three Percenters

Three Percenters are part of the militia movement, which supports the idea of a small number of dedicated "patriots" protecting Americans from government tyranny, just as the patriots of the American Revolution protected early Americans from British tyranny.

- The tyranny is leftist policies on guns and immigration
- Occasionally will appear at white supremacy rallies but only to join violence
- Held a "United Against Hate" rally in Washington



Patriot Front

Patriot Front (PF) is a white nationalist hate group that formed in the aftermath of the deadly "Unite the Right" rally in Charlottesville, Virginia, of August 12, 2017.



The PF founder, Thomas Rousseau, led nationalists during the "Unite the Right," including James Alex Fields, Jr., the driver that murdered anti-racist protester

Northwest Republic




The "Republic" and its flag are based on the so-called "Northwest Imperative," a longstanding call by some white supremacists for white people to move to the Pacific Northwest and establish their own country there. The idea is promoted on the Internet and in various novels.

QAnon

QAnon is a global, wide-reaching and remarkably elaborate conspiracy theory that has taken root within some parts of the pro-Trump movement. It is an amalgam of both novel and well-established theories, with marked undertones of antisemitism and xenophobia.

Fundamentally, the theory claims that almost every president in recent American history up until Donald Trump has been a puppet put in place by a global elite of power brokers hell bent on enriching themselves and maintaining their Satanic child-murdering sex cult.

How Serious Is This Issue?



From 2012 through 2021, nearly three in four murders classified as domestic terrorism were committed by <u>right-wing extremists</u> (most of whom were white nationalists).

In 2020:

- 55% of <u>perpetrators of hate crime</u>s were white
- 21% were Black
- 16% were of unknown racial background.
- 62% percent of hate crimes were about race/ethnicity
- 25% were about sexual orientation/gender identity,
- 13% were about religion.



- Ideas formulated earlier in life have a tendency to persist




Intervening & Building Resilience



Learn to recognize warning signs of exposure:

- Blaming immigrants for the spread of COVID-19
- Belief that the pandemic is part of a "global elite" or Jewish conspiracy
- Excitement about social chaos or prospect of societal collapse
- Accusations of tyrannical government overreach regarding stay-at home orders and mask mandates
- Belief that the 2020 presidential election was fraudulent
- Fear of a "great replacement" or "white genocide"
- Belief in male supremacy or expressions of misogyny
