AGENCY FUNDING

- Agency operations are fully funded by fees paid for licensing
 - Executive Director, IT and budget/policy staff
 - Licensure
 - Professional Practices
 - Two staff from Educator Preparation and Pathways
- Fees paid for licensing are a "fee for service", regardless of the term of the license or whether the application results in a license
- Positions funded through an interagency agreement with ODE or other grant money
 - Licensure Barrier Reduction Specialist/License Expense Reimbursement
 - Social Emotional Learning/Trauma Informed Practices Specialist
 - Apprenticeships
 - Oregon Administrator Scholars program (likely moving to HECC)

Educator Preparation & Pathways (formerly Program Approval)

- Approve the university programs which prepare educators
- Apprenticeships

- Personnel Services
 - School Counselor
 - School Psychologist
 - School Social Worker
- School Nurse
- Charter School Registries

License Types within the Categories

- Emergency (1 year)
- Restricted (1 year)
- Reciprocal (1 year teachers; 18 months administrators)
- Preliminary/Principal (3 years)
- Professional (5 years)
- And a few others for special circumstances

ENDORSEMENTS

- All licenses must hold an endorsement
- But endorsements matter most on Teaching Licenses
- Teaching licenses can have multiple endorsements, specific to their content area(s)
 - Course to Endorsement Catalogue
- Substitute licenses hold only a substitute endorsement, permitting them to accept assignments in any content area
- Administrators and Personnel Services License hold only one endorsement, to match their license type

TEACHERS ADDING ENDORSEMENTS LICENSE FOR CONDITIONAL ASSIGNMENT

- Must hold a Preliminary or Professional Teaching License
- Adding an endorsement or teaching the content more than 10 hours per week
- Not due until 10/31

- One year if the endorsement can be added:
 - Professional license: content test only
 - Preliminary license: content test plus practicum

SUBSTITUTE LICENSES

Full Substitute

- Have completed teacher preparation
- No PDUs to renew
- May accept assignments as long as one academic year
- Three-year term

District Substitute (New July 2023)

- Can only work in the sponsoring district
- A single assignment cannot be for longer than 10 consecutive days (ORS 342.610 and local bargaining agreements)

Restricted Substitute

- Have completed a bachelor's degree (no teacher prep)
- No PDUs to renew
- A single assignment cannot be for longer than 10 consecutive days (ORS 342.610 and local bargaining agreements)
- Requires district sponsorship but can sub in any district
- One-year term for first license
- Renewal: Three-year term if they apply on time and maintain the same sponsoring district

Other licenses that can sub:

Preliminary, Professional (teaching, school counselor or admin), Principal, CTE (Restricted, Preliminary and Professional)

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATORS


- ODE (Oregon Department of Education) oversees Perkins and Measure 98 (Student Success Act) funded Programs of Study
- The Regional CTE Coordinator is your friend for newly hired CTE teachers
- Instructor Appraisal Committee reviews the candidate for endorsement eligibility (get to know your CTE Regional Coordinator)
- TSPC issues the license
- License Types:
 - Restricted CTE (sponsored)
 - Preliminary CTE (3-year)
 - Professional CTE (5-year)
- There is no Emergency CTE license because of the funding requirements

OTHER SPONSORED TEACHING LICENSES

Limited Teaching

- Specific subject
- The Commission doesn't offer an endorsement
- District-Sponsored
- Three-year license
- Cannot be a TOSA

International Visiting Teacher

- US State Department J1 Visa
- Licensed in another country
- Reissued yearly with proof of J1 Visa

OTHER ADMINISTRATOR LICENSES

Reciprocal Administrator License:

- Holds a full administrator license from another state
- Valid for 18 months to complete Oregon Law and Finance (be sure they enroll ASAP)
- After 18 months, will be awarded the Principal or Professional, depending on preparation and experience
- Caution: some states don't offer preparation and licensure beyond the Principal license

Emergency Administrator License Circumstances:

- Short term, one time only assignment
- Retired administrator with a lapsed license
- Failure to complete requirements for Principal while on the Restricted
- Out of state program completers with unusual preparation
- Not yet enrolled in a Principal preparation program

PERSONNEL SERVICES

School Counselor

- Emergency
- Restricted
 - 1 year renewable 4 times
 - Must be enrolled
- [Preliminary] School Counselor
 - 3 years
- Professional
 - 5 years

School Psychologist

- [Preliminary] School Psychologist
 - 3 years
- Professional
 - 5 years

School Social Worker

- Emergency
- Restricted
 - 1 year renewable 3 times
- [Preliminary] School Social Worker
 - 3 years
- Professional
 - 5 years

Limited Student Services

- 3 years
- Restricted to the sponsoring district
- Bachelor's degree
- One year of graduate level coursework or professional experience
- Not a school counselor or school psychologist
- Endorsements: Student Assistance Specialist or Behavior Specialist

OUT OF STATE PREPARED ANY CATEGORY

Reciprocity means honoring the other state's

- License, credential, certificate
- Endorsements equivalent to those approved by the Commission
- Program approval standards
- Content knowledge preparation
- States with severe shortages might compromise their preparation standards or license requirements
- Professional Practices standards

Common issues - Endorsements

- Levels for Elementary
 - Early childhood
 - Birth to grade 3
 - K-6
 - K-8
 - We grant K-8. Content prep thru 8th grade is problematic for some
- Categorical Special Education
 - Mild/Moderate
 - Severe
 - Autism Spectrum Disorders
 - Emotionally Disturbed
 - We grant Special Education: Generalist

Administrators

- Lack Oregon Law and Finance
- Require employment prior to issuing the credential
- Not requiring licensure for Superintendents
- Not offering two-tiered system (Principal and Professional)

SPONSORED LICENSES – DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

- Bug the educator about their program enrollment
- Continually follow up with them on their progress
- Caution on out of state programs:
 - It is difficult for in-service teachers to add endorsements for programs located in Arizona
 - Western Governor's may require an extra semester to "student teach"
 - Make sure the program being completed is approved for licensure in the other state
- Bug them again about progress in their program

RENEWALS AND REISSUES

Renewable Licenses

- Preliminary/Principal
- Professional
- Limited
- The requirement for renewing educators to submit PDUs is currently suspended through 6/30/2029.
 - It doesn't mean:
 - They don't have to earn them or
 - That districts shouldn't submit the PEER form
- Licenses expiring on or after 7/1/2029 will be expected to submit PDU verification
- Reissued Licenses
 - Restricted
 - License for Conditional Assignment
 - "Reissue" means the license requires continued sponsorship and proof of progress towards full licensure districts should be following up with those completing programs

DATES, DEADLINES AND TIMELINES

120-day Grace Period

• Granted for renewals and reissues only, IF the educator submits the application and fee prior to the expiration of the existing license (Emergency license types not eligible)

90 days – ORS 342.125 (aka Senate 205 [2017])

- Permits an educator with a cleared background check to begin their assignment prior to license issuance for **90 days from the** date of the application the district tracks this 90 days
- Most districts exercise this option

90 days – Incomplete Application

• When TSPC evaluates an application, if more information is needed, the application will remain "open" for 90 days from the date TSPC notifies the applicant of the missing information

NOTE: An applicant's 90 days to work under ORS 342.125 will expire prior to the 90 days before the application is "closed"

30 days - Request Review of License Issued


• If a license is issued incorrectly or the applicant can produce additional evidence to support a different license, they can request a review of an application within 30 days of the date the license was issued

ELICENSING

- First implemented January 2016 with only the ability for educator to apply and pay the licensing fee online
- Version 2.0 implemented April 2019, making eLicensing the "database of record" for Oregon Educator Licensing
- Places more responsibility on the educator to complete the licensing process
 - Check eLicensing for Status and Messages
 - License Image is available to educators
- District portal provides more information
 - Senate Bill 155 "flags"
 - Application and license status
 - Background check date
 - Secure login required
- The work on eLicensing is finalized
- Plans are being made to secure and implement a new online portal and database

TSPC WEBSITE

- Redesigned in June
 2020
- Menu across the top
- Drop downs to division-specific pages
- Information provided in PDFs for easier navigation and saving of frequently utilized pages
- The Schools, Districts and ESDs should be of particular interest
