Amity School District 4-J is seeking qualified applicants for a Woods Manufacturing teaching position at Amity High School. If you are energetic, enthusiastic, love kids, and want to be part of a great staff, review the specific qualifications and apply.

The candidate should be able to:

- Continue established relationships with industry partners;
- Begin new partnerships to meet Industry and Program needs;
- Continue to work with MVEC to keep our program of study current;
- Collaborate with local cabinet shops and local artisans;
- Be willing to learn, use, tweak and communicate a new woods manufacturing curriculum, reporting back to The MiLL/ Peyton Woods what was effective and what needs improvement;
- Be familiar with CNC technology and the use of Computer Aided Design Software (Vectric Aspire);
- Be familiar with the use and maintenance for Cabinet Shop tools including Saw Stop table saw, band saw, drill press, power sander, router, mortise machine, and sliding compound miter saw;
- Be willing to work with a large format CNC, small format CNC and CNC Laser and use it in curriculum;
- Be willing to work toward earning the W.C.A. (Woodwork Career Alliance) Teacher Credential, and use it in the classroom;
- Be willing and able to continue the tradition of building a blanket chest for the Amity Education Foundation Dinner and Auction in April;
- Use shop technology entrepreneurially in the classroom to fundraise for programs;
- Be familiar with processes of cabinet making and furniture building;
