JOB DESCRIPTION

Social Worker – Counselor

NOTE: This position is short term, beginning in April, through the end of the 2025-2026 school year. Luckiamute Valley Charter Schools operate on a 4-day work week.

Qualifications:

Master's degree in social work, counseling, or related field. Successful experience working with at risk students.

Job Summary:

The Social Worker or counselor provides direct and indirect services, including counseling to students experiencing social, emotional and/or behavioral problems that interfere with their performance in school, and facilitates communication among school, home and community providers.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assists teachers and parents in developing behavior management plans to remediate problem behaviors.
- Assists school staff in developing and implementing interventions to allow students with disabilities to be successful within mainstream.
- Assists students to improve their academic, personal and social functioning.
- Provides social skills, anger management, stress reduction or other similar instruction to students who are experiencing social/emotional/behavioral problems that interfere with their learning or the ability of others to learn.
- Provides short-term individual and group counseling to students who are experiencing social/emotional/behavioral problems that interfere with their learning or the ability of others to learn. Provides information to families and assists them in accessing long-term or intensive counseling services, as needed.
- Continually assesses and takes leadership role in communicating and problem solving on such issues as attendance, mental health, suicide prevention/awareness, behavior management, crisis intervention, homelessness, child abuse, neglect, and the importance of confidentiality with staff to best meet the needs of students.
- Communicates with staff, administration and parents concerning students' social, emotional and behavioral progress when needed.
- Provides information to students and parents about services available within the community. Makes referrals to community providers, as appropriate
- Consults and collaborates with social services, mental health and other community providers.
- Maintains an accurate record of student, parent and other contacts.
- Conducts risk assessments.
- Coordinates home, school and community resources in addressing the crisis situation.
- Coordinates follow-up services as needed.

Luckiamute Valley Charter Schools are in a beautiful rural setting, outside of Dallas and Monmouth. LVCS serves students in grades K-8 on two campuses, Bridgeport and Pedee. LVCS offers generous benefits that include PERS 6% pickup, comprehensive health benefits, an innovative, collaborative work environment with a 4-day a week school and work schedule. (Monday-Thursday)

Salary and Benefits: This position is a short-term contract and does not include medical, dental, or vision insurance benefits. Compensation is competitive and includes employer-paid PERS retirement pick-up in accordance with policy.
