

HOW WE CAN BULD CAPACITY

Through Capacity building efforts that:

- Expose parents to the various roles they can play in their children's education
- Build parents' skills and sense of efficacy to succeeded in those roles
- Build and enhance the skills, compositions of schools and organization staff to partner with families
- Build the dual capacity of both families and staff at once
- Assist schools to examine their core believes about families and their ability to support students success.
- Partner with thrust community-bases organizations

ESSENCIAL CONDITIONS

There are certain conditions that must be met BEFORE parents can be effective engaged in their children's learning and development and school improvement.

- Parents must believe that they have a role(role construction)
- Parents must have the confidence that they play a role and succeed (self-efficacy)
- Families need the skills and knowledge to negotiate these roles
- School and other organizations must invite engagement and welcome, honor and connect families to learn (Joining Process)
- Families must have access to supports that enable their engagement

Family Role

Roles that parents play when they are effectively engage in their child's learning and development.

- o Supporter of their children's learning
- o Encourager of an academic identity, a positive self-image resources
- o **Monitors** of their children's time, behavior, boundaries and resources
- o Model for life learning and enthusiasm for education
- o Advocates for improved learning opportunities for their children and at their schools
- o Decision-maker/choosers of educational opportunities for their children, school and community.
- o Collaborators with school staff and members of the community.
