# Assessment Guidance

Criteria	
1. Clear Purpose	Why am I assessing?
2. Clear Learning Target(s)	What am I assessing?
3. Quality Assessment	How can I assess it well?
4. Proper Test Administration	How will I ensure test conditions do not interfere with a student's ability to perform well on a test?
5. Effective Communication of Results	How will I share results for maximum impact?

# Purpose

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ELPA21's purpose is to provide assessments that best measure English language learners' mastery of the communication demands of states' rigorous academic standards.

The **ELPA21 Field Test** is to systematically collect student responses on the new test items in order to evaluate items and begin calibration.

# Learning Targets: Claims

Test Domain	Domain Claim
Listening	1. The English Language Learner <b>can listen and comprehend spoken English</b> in grade appropriate* activities.
Reading	2. The English Language Learner <b>can read and comprehend written English</b> in grade appropriate* activities.
Writing	3. The English language learner can <b>write English</b> in grade appropriate* activities.
Speaking	4. The English Language Learner can <b>speak English</b> in grade appropriate* activities.

\* Grade appropriate refers to the ELPA21 Grade Bands: K, 1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12.

# Quality Assessment: Scoring Protocol



The ELPA21 Field Test will include both

- **Machine Scored Items**
  - Selected Response
  - Drag and Drop
- **Human Scored Items**
  - Developing Scoring Rubrics
  - Trained raters employed by Questar
  - Incorporating ongoing read-behinds, validity papers, and range-finding process
