### Classroom strategies English Learner conference participants shared that they could use to prepare students for an assessment with fewer supports

- Teach students how to brainstorm ideas and organize thoughts so they are able to be successful now that graphic organizers are not provided
- Practice in 1<sup>st</sup> language prior to the test and make the connections explicit
- Practice reading and listening to directions prior to actual test
- Use Essential Skills Work Samples as a tool to practice assessment techniques
- Pre-teach writing skills and expectations prior to assessment in classes and have students use Smarter Balanced scoring guides to score their own writing prior to the assessment
- Require students to explain thinking on math and in writing
- Implement technology lessons
- Familiarize students with word processing and explaining ideas
- Teach test/academic vocabulary so they know what it is they are being asked to do
- For math, provide a daily warm-up to practice decoding and looking at variables needed to solve problem
- Students need to practice with spell check tools

- Make sure to develop the ability to take notes, articulate main points in notes
- Reinforce students in attending to precision
- Using assessment-like vocabulary when providing instruction
- Explicitly teach graphic organizers
- Teach writing process
- Use peer editing prior to Smarter Balanced
- Practice editing and scoring with Smarter Balanced scoring guide prior to the test and use as part of peer editing process
- Teach writing process with special attention to transition words.
- Revision practice for writing samples
- Teach students to create their own graphic organizers
- Teach students revision steps
- Practice revising
- Teach writing process in a way they will internalize it, and be able to use it from memory
- Take away scaffolds in class before testing to see how well students internalize them
- Teach and use writing process
- Use same language for directions to explain activity
- Teach the "directions" language in English
- Practice using the directions in class; in class start with translating directions to native languages
- Translate practice test directions into native language so they know what they mean when they see them in English
- Teach students to diagram the directions: circle key terms and recognize multiple parts of the question.

## Classroom Strategies English Learner Conference Participants Shared That They Could Use to Prepare student for Assessment with More Support

- Train for checking spelling—give them examples to identify
- Work on listening comprehension
- Identify question types and answer them using a similar platform
- Provide lessons on all of the different tools available in the category of "writing tools"
- Teach students how to use supports on computer prior to test administration
- Explain how to decipher definition
- Teach "synonym"
- Explain limitations of spell check and thesauruses
- Teach students when to use tools
- Teaching word processing tools: spell check, strikethrough, etc.
- Create assignments that teach students to take notes while reading and how to use notes in their writing
- Use Google Chrome with Google Docs and add tools like dictionary, spell check, notes to get them familiar with using online tools
- Practice on Google Drive with typing and using spell check
- Teach students how to use speech-to-text
- Teach electronic glossary use
- Teach students when to use a glossary
