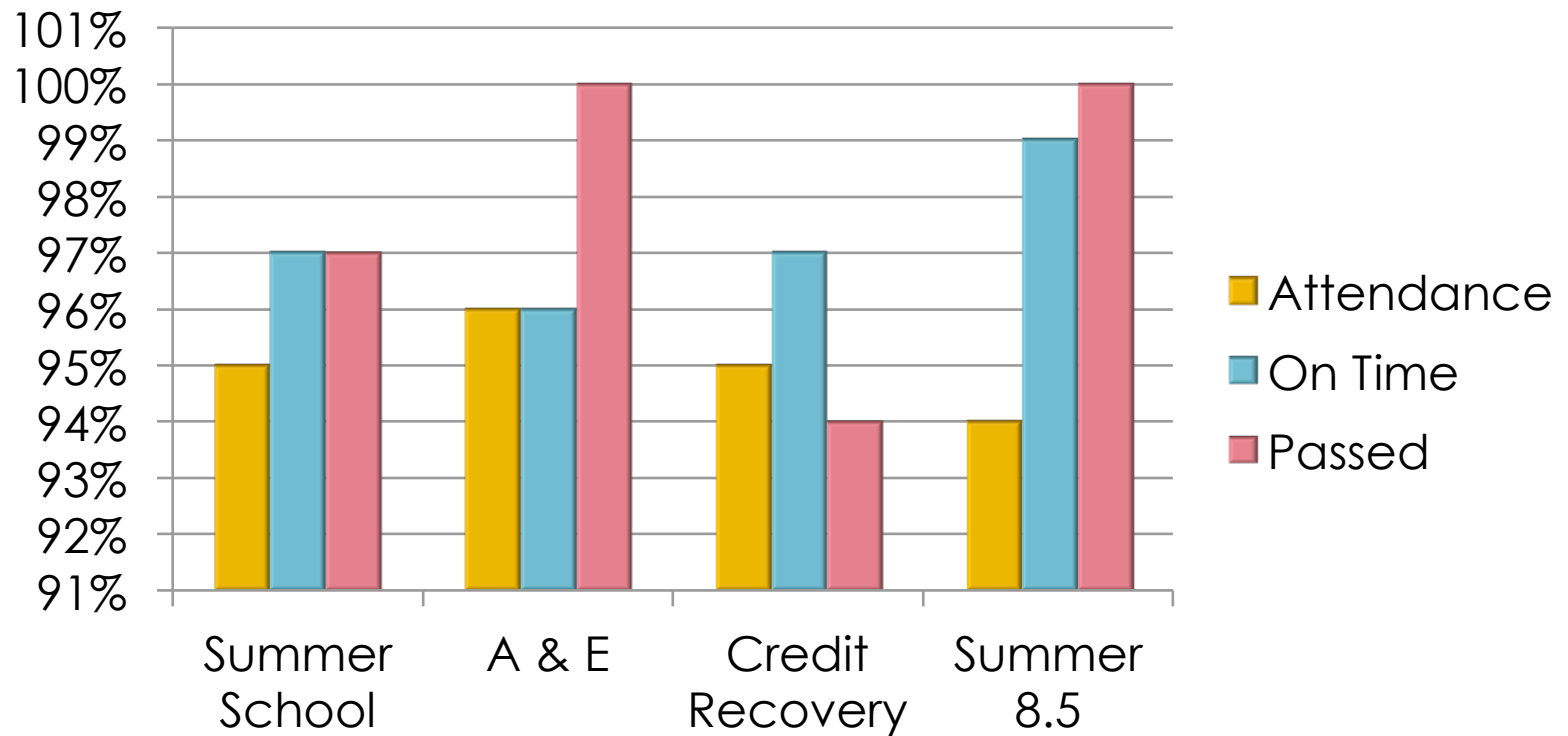

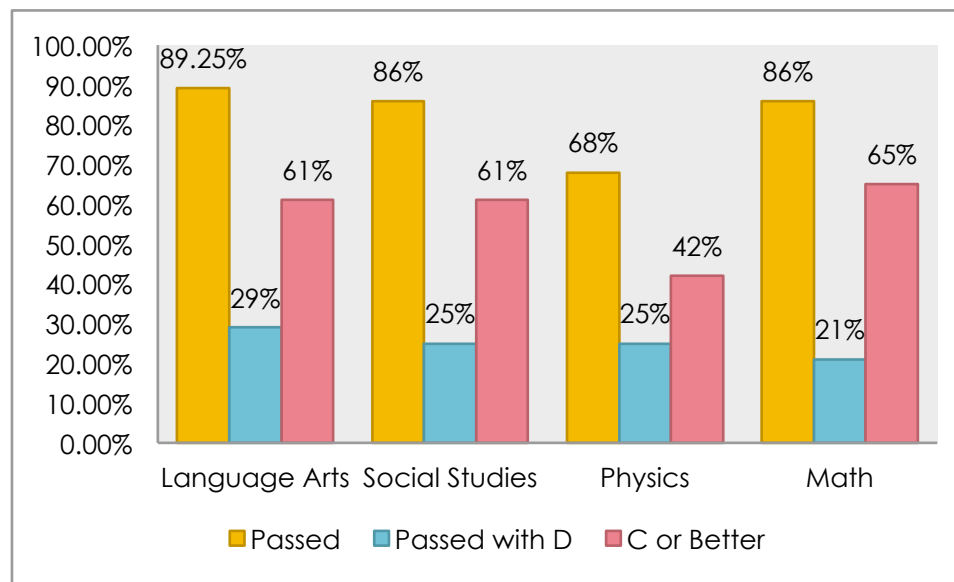
- Emphasis on BSD Secondary behavior learning targets:

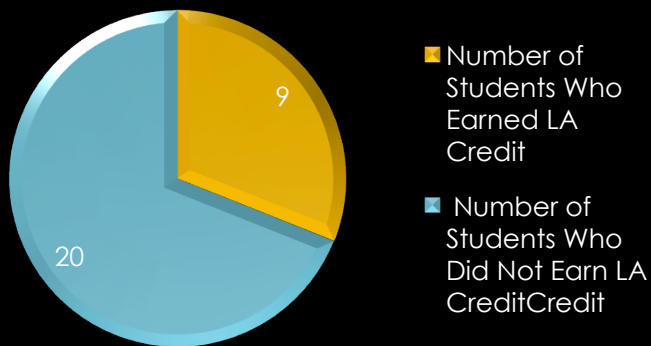
- ▣ How we chose our offerings

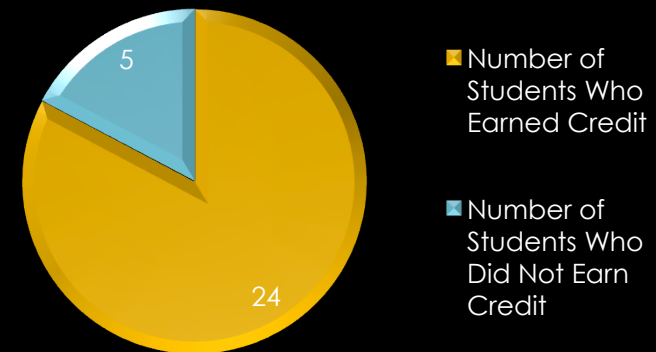
- ▣ Why Pass/Fail?

Credits

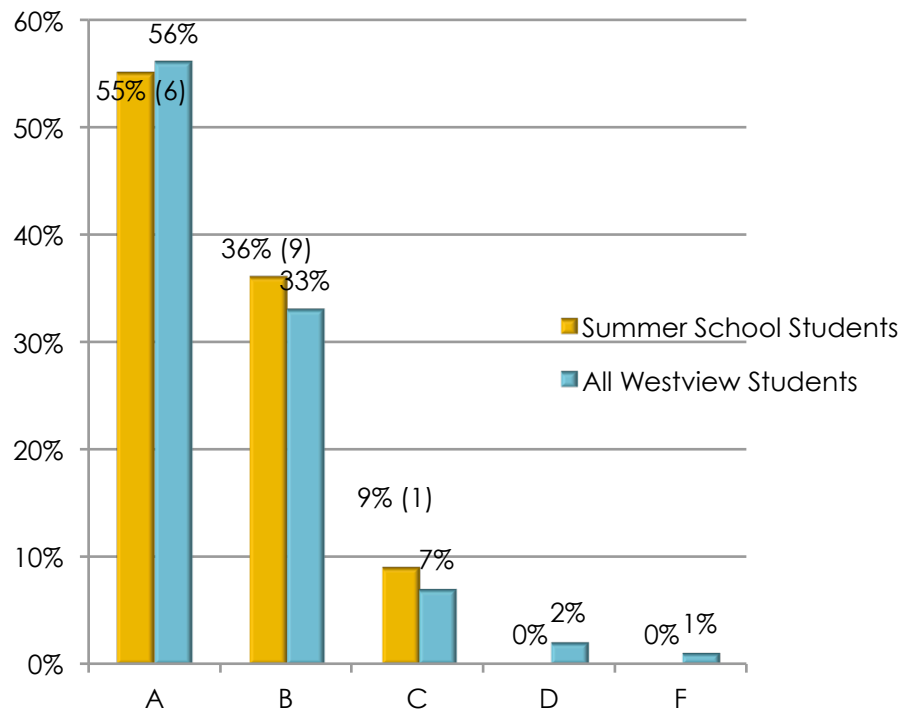
- ▣ Acceleration

 - ▣ 1.0 A-F
 - ▣ Must be transcribed

- ▣ Enrichment
 - ▣ Pre-AP .5 P/F
 - ▣ SAT – No credit

A & E Grade Distribution

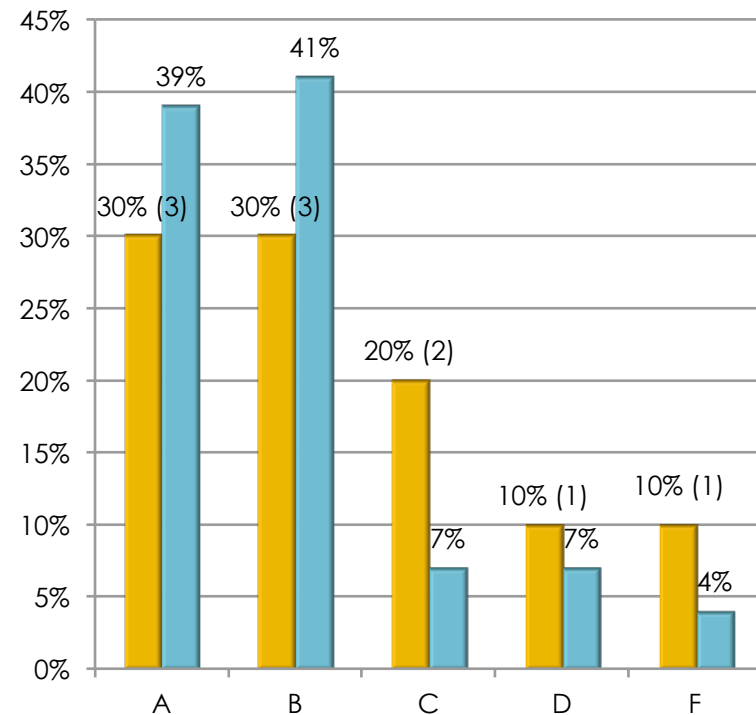
Geometry to AA2

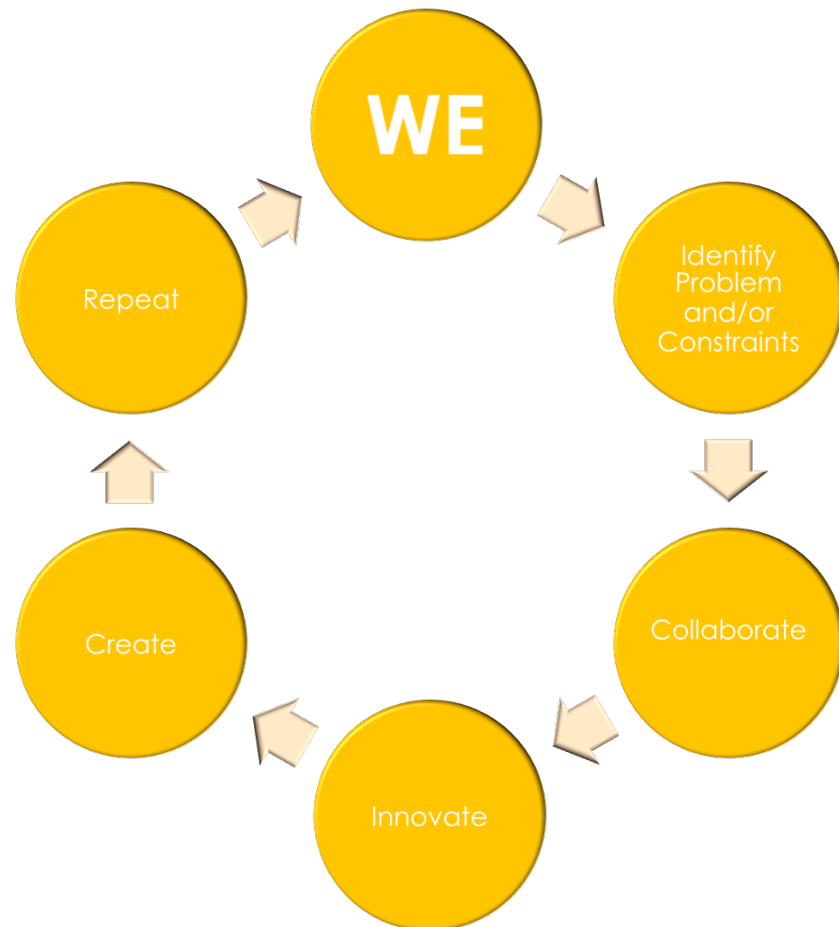
