#### **OBJECTIVES:**

A brief history of how and when all day kindergarten was implemented in Morrow County School District.

Audience will be taken through an all day kindergarten schedule; also discuss changes for next year.

Presenter will outline procedures used in MCSD for kindergarten screening process and parent involvement.

Examples will be provided of quarterly assessments and rubrics designed using Common Core State Standards to report student grades and benchmark proficiency.

Question and answer session

- Morrow County School District is spread out in three separate communities: Irrigon, Boardman, and Heppner.
- All day kindergarten was piloted in the Irrigon community at A.C. Houghton Elementary in the 1994-95 school year. This is the same year district went to a 4-day week.
- May 8, 1995 board passed full-day, 4-days a week kindergarten district wide for 1995-96.
- MCSD has paid out in excess of \$7 million dollars in the 18 years to pilot, implement, and sustain full day kindergarten.

## Kindergarten Screening

#### May - paperwork for pre- registration

- Birth certificates, September 1<sup>st</sup> deadline
- Immunizations records
- Parent survey describing students strengths and weaknesses, also health concerns
- Hearing & Eye screen
- Preparation list for students to practice/prepare over the summer
- Secretary calls and schedules an appointment for August

#### August – academic screen by Kinder teachers

- Uppercase/Lowercase Letter identification
- Sounds
- Colors
- Number Recognition 0-10
- Counting
- Shapes
- Name Writing & Pencil Grasp
- Cooperation Score

#### Kindergarten Screening/Placement

August, use yearly assessment to screen all students within 15 minute appointment. Score test results.

Kindergarten teachers get together and build class list based off of above scores. Distribute low, medium, high students, ESL, IEP, speech, requests, family history, personality.

Use same assessment throughout school year to monitor progress, benchmark proficiency, grading.
