MOE - Definition

Any School District (LEA) receiving an IDEA Part B subgrant must budget and expend <u>at least</u> the same amount of local, or state and local, funds for the education of children with disabilities as it did in the previous year.

LEAs must meet the:

- Eligibility (Budget) Standard
- Compliance (Expenditure) Standard



MOE- Eligibility Standard

"For purposes of establishing the LEA's eligibility for an award for a fiscal year, the SEA must determine that the LEA budgets, for the education of children with disabilities, at least the same amount, from at least one of the following sources, as the LEA spent for that purpose from the same source for the most recent fiscal year for which information is available: (i) Local funds only; (ii) The combination of State and local funds; (iii) Local funds only on a per capita basis; or (iv) The combination of State and local funds on a per capita basis."



MOE- Compliance Standard

"An LEA meets this [compliance] standard if it does **not** reduce the level of expenditures for the education of children with disabilities made by the LEA from at least one of the following sources below the level of those expenditures from the same source for the preceding fiscal year,

- except as provided in §§ 300.204 and 300.205:
- (i) Local funds only; (ii) The combination of State and local funds; (iii) Local funds only on a per capita basis; or (iv) The combination of State and local funds on a per capita basis."



MOE-Subsequent Year's Rule

A change in 2015

Subsequent Year's rule: The comparison year for determining if an LEA meets the eligibility and compliance standards is the last year the LEA met MOE using the same method.

The comparison year is subject to the Subsequent Years rule at 34 CFR §300.203(c). If an LEA fails MOE, the level of expenditures required in the following year is the amount that would have been required in the absence of that failure, not the LEA's reduced level of expenditures

MOE-Subsequent Year's Rule

Oregon Department of Education was notified of its failure to apply the Subsequent Year's Rule change in the Fall of 2018.

This change resulted in:

- A change in the number of districts meeting
- A change in the use of consortium to meet MOE



MOE - Consortium Model

If a district previously met MOE under a consortium, and applied for IDEA funds as an individual district, then they are legally obligated to the requirements of MOE independent of the consortium.

IDEA Application

This Assurance Statement must be completed and signed by the Superintendent or other authorized representative of the district. By signing this Statement of Assurances, the District assures that it will operate in accordance with all the requirements of IDEA 2004 and related federal and state laws and regulations throughout the period of the grant award. **One** Statement of Assurances is required from **each** district. Each district should carefully read and review the IDEA 2004 statute and regulations and the state statutes and regulations related to this Statement of Assurances.



IDEA Application Changes

- October 2018, Oregon was notified by OSEP, that as an SEA, it failed to maintain State Financial Support (MOE).
- During this process, along with the allocation reduction, ODE was required to review and update IDEA procedures
- Included in this procedural review was the distribution of IDEA funds to LEAs.
- Areas of non-compliance under IDEA Sec. 300.705 Subgrants to LEAs and Sec. 300.704 Statewide Activities
 - Regional, OSD, and LTCT cannot be counted in the LEA award amount.
 Local LEAs must provide consent to have those funds redistributed.



IDEA Application- Changes

Several changes will be added to the LEA Application for IDEA. These will include:

- Designation of service/cost for OSD, LTCT, and Regional
- A district can choose to retain the IDEA flow-through dollars to meet the service needs or redistribute them to ODE contracted providers. (ORS 343.236 (4))



IDEA Application- Changes

 If a district chooses to retain the services contracted with ODE through OSD, Regional, and/or LTCT or any combination of the three, they will need to provide a plan and assurances that students qualifying for Regional under OAR 343.236 will receive appropriate services by qualified personnel.



Regional Program Funding-Budget

- The IDEA award amount is different than the General Fund reduction. The GBB calls for a reduction of 6.2 M to our current service levels.
- If this is not restored, we will work with regional contractors to reduce the award amount for the 2019-2021 biennium.



Estimates for the 2019-2021 Biennium

General Fund: \$22.5M

Federal Funds: \$33.6M

Total Funds: \$56.5M

- Promotion & awareness of Oregon's statewide school safety tip line (SafeOregon).
