Licensure Redesign Committee



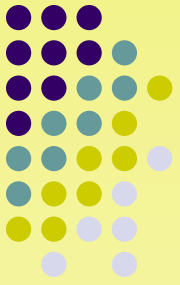
- Formed July 2012

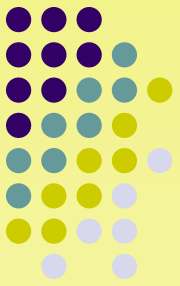

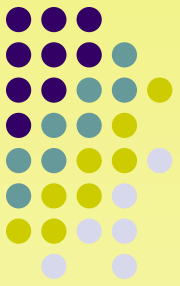

Preliminary Teaching License



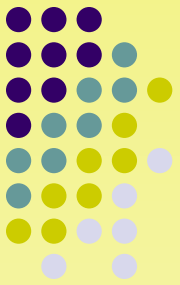
- New completers
- No experience
- Renewable once if employed
- Renewable continuously if not employed
- Must advance to Professional Teaching License

Possibility of “interim” license



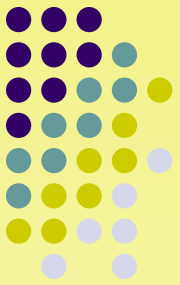
- Between Preliminary and Professional:
 - A “transitional” license for people who are not employed, but need to keep their license to stay in the job market
 - New teachers not employed first 6 years;
 - Unemployed veteran teachers (who still have not obtained employment), etc.

Professional Teaching License



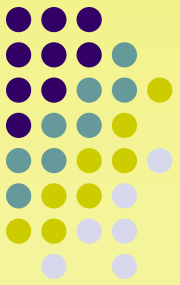
- Master's or Equivalent
- 10 semester or 15 quarter hrs beyond initial program ($\frac{1}{2}$ graduate; $\frac{1}{2}$ undergrad) degree applicable credits (if have master's)
- Five years experience teaching
- Renewable with CPD

Distinguished Teaching License



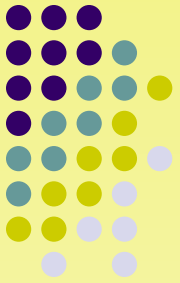
- Master's or above
- Five years experience teaching
- Renewable with criteria
 - Continued evidence of distinguished engagement

Distinguished Teaching License



- Sample of Distinguished Activity
 - National Boards
 - CTL Program
 - Teacher Leader
 - EdD or EdS
 - Specialization (Autism; Elementary math coach)
 - Mentor new Teacher
 - Cooperating Teacher (student teachers)

- No mandatory practicum



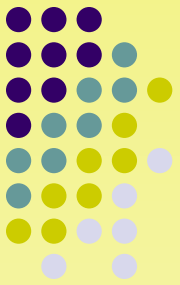
